

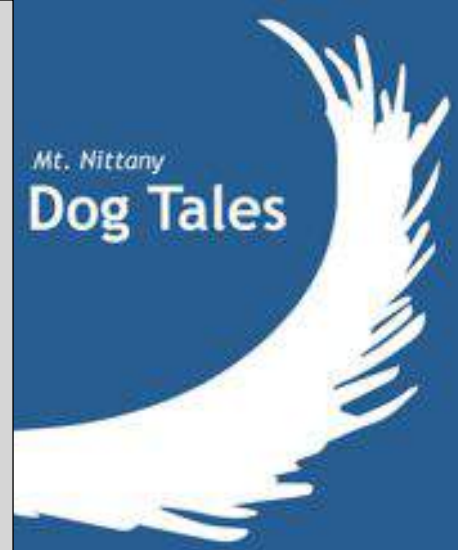

From the MNDTC Education Committee - Survey Results

The Education Committee conducted a poll of MNDTC members in order to evaluate how to best align activities with membership interests. Ann Marie Raup led this effort, with support from Cynthia Rabbers. Fifty-five members participated; the survey questions, results and committee conclusions are below.

Do you think hosting specialized training and seminars is an important part of the club?

Result: 95% checked yes, 0% checked no, and 5% checked not sure.

Committee Conclusion: continue organizing seminars.

What is the most you would be willing to spend for training or a seminar?

Mark ALL that apply: Half Day <\$50, \$50-80, \$80-120, >\$120.

Result: There was a wide spread of answers. The results were inconsistent and indicated different interpretations of the question. Some people checked one price range for half day and one price range for a full day, while other members checked each price range up to the maximum they were willing to pay.

Committee Conclusion: endeavor to pursue best value when planning seminars.

Rate your interest in the following topics: Low, Medium or High.

Result ranked by interest: agility, fitness and conditioning, obedience, health and nutrition, nose work, tracking, rally, barn hunt, search and rescue and fly ball.

Members added the following topics: herding, hunting for sport, freestyle/trick, dock diving, non-AKC venues (CPE, CDSP and WCRL) and Confidence building.

Committee Conclusion: continuing organizing agility and obedience seminars and explore fitness and conditioning.

AKC Novice Trick Dog Class

The MNDTC is offering a new class for handlers and dogs who want to earn an AKC Trick Dog title. Participating dogs are required to have passed Beginning Obedience or KPT Puppy.

There are four possible titles:

1. Novice Trick Dog (TKN)
2. Intermediate Trick Dog (TKI)
3. Advanced Trick Dog (TKA)
4. Trick Dog Performer (TKP)

An AKC Canine Good Citizen evaluator can judge dogs for Novice, Intermediate and Advanced titles.

To earn a Performer title, handlers must submit a video to the AKC.

In the class, handlers and dogs are learning 20 tricks that are required for the Novice title, plus an additional seven handler-option tricks. Students are enthusiastic about the new



things they are learning and dogs are having a blast. Graduation will consist of an official evaluation of the tricks learned, with titles earned by successful teams.

Because of its great success, this class will be offered again in the spring, with the possibility of expanding evaluations to the Intermediate and Advanced trick dog levels.

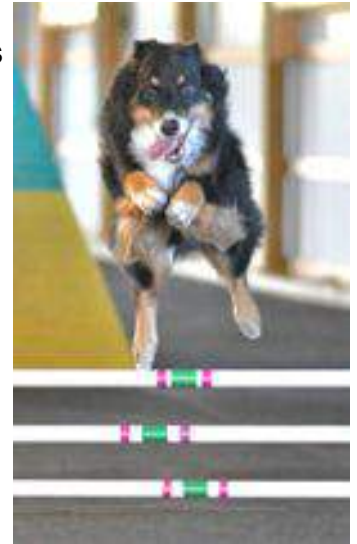
The MNDTC AKC Agility Trial held on Sept. 23–24, 2017 in the Ag Choice Building, Rock Springs, was a success thanks to the many, many club members who came out to help from beginning to end. 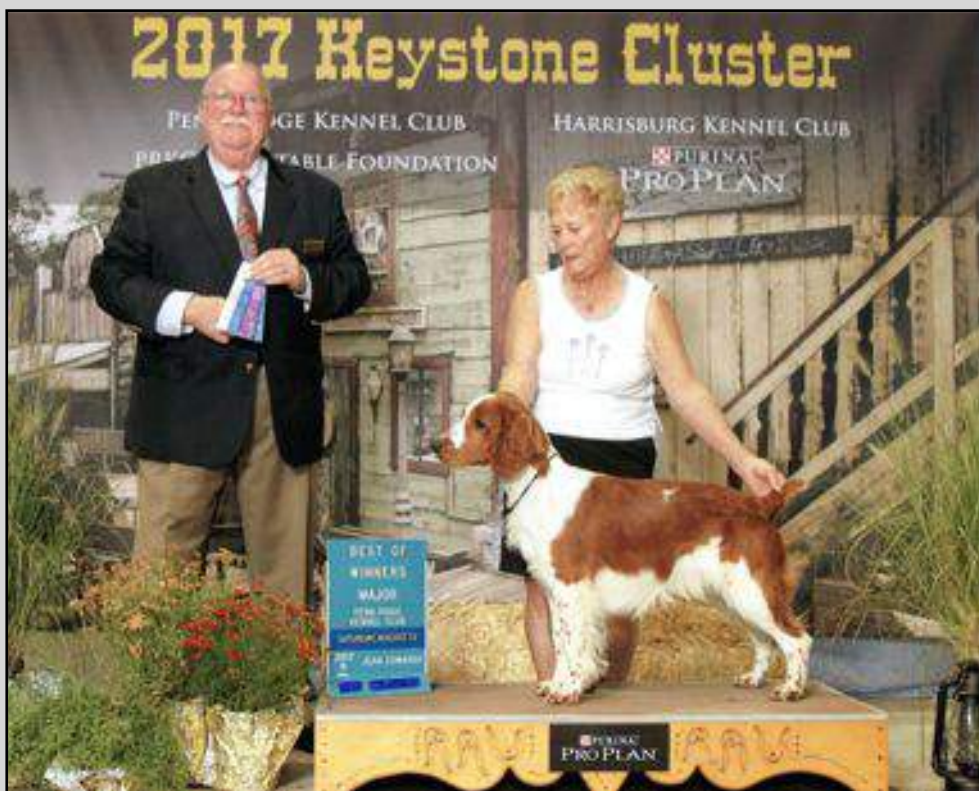
